& 31, bank parking lot.


This will be our last field trip this year, so let's have a big turnout.

WARNING ON TICKS

These insects normally appear after a wet period. Walkers, hunters and campers have picked up as many as 10 of the little vermin on their bodies. Dogs are highly susceptible to ticks, which not only bite, but can cause infection.

"If one gets to you," advised entomologist Ron Hawtnorne, "don't try to pull it out. In almost every instance, the head remains in the flesh and will infect." Applying a cigarette or other heat to the tick doesn't work either. The best solution is to carry a vial of laundry bleach and invert it over the tick, which not only makes it back out, but disinfects the bite.


