

I know it might seem intimidating, but if you want to give it a try I know you will be able to do this.



The picture above is the entire lab. There are 2 stations where tools are used to remove sediment to get down to the fossil. At the far corner is an enclosed blaster unit that is used for final prep. A few rules, so you know. You must wear glasses because the tools can throw pieces of roc or mud up. Hearing protection is also required as the dust collectors make noise. Mask are required, due to health dept rules and there is some dust. Don't worry there is a restroom just outside the lab.

So what tools will you use????....brushes, micro jacks, dremels, picks. These are all small tools, so strength is not an issue. You just need some patience and be willing to learn.

Above is a closer view of one of the workstations. This is a sauropod bone. You can see the tools are small.

I believe Mark plans to start building the museum to showcase these bones this year, so your work will be on display at some point!
