I have great news to pass on. Today I was notified that the facility where our plans to build a studio, have been given the go ahead. Everyone was excited at our last meeting to move the club in a positive direction and possibly increase membership. There are still some questions to be answered, but the organization has given the green light for us to start. There are upgrades that we will need to accomplish and I will be asking for recommendations and volunteers to assist. At the June meeting I will go over these upgrades and the overall proposal I submitted. Please be thinking of ways we can use this facility and how to get the word out. I do have ideas, but I want to hear from you, the members. The program for the June meeting will involve us taking a little trip to the facility and giving everyone the chance to comment. I wish I could divulge the location, but until all questions are answered I have been asked to keep it under wraps.

Along with that we were given the opportunity to purchase all of the contents of member Bill Krull's studio. I approved the purchase as we Facebook: Holly Kraftor, Nancy Foreman, had 3 days to make the decision prior to it being turned over to the auction house. We paid \$2500 dollars for the entire contents which involves polishers, grinders, trim saws, Ultra tec faceting machine, torches, too many to count hand tools, storage bins, benches, stools and many other items related to lapidary. Bill also built stringed instruments(luthier), stained glass, fusing glass, ceramics, pottery all of which now belong to the club. I would like to thank Bob Miller and John Jaworski for the assistance in evaluating this equipment.

> This purchase saved the club thousands of dollars in starting up our studio. We hope to sell off material from the non lapidary items to pay for the cost and possibly pay for some of the space upgrades. We are not taking the kiln in the corner so if anyone knows or wants a pottery or ceramic kiln I can put you in touch with Bill's son and possibly a real good deal.

Bill, John, and I have removed all of the hazardous waste from the space and have taken 6 boxes of waste to the St. Joseph County Hazardous Waste Facility.

I will be asking for volunteers in June to assist in the removal of all items and in cleaning the studio up. The Pastor has given us the green light to store the items in the basement until our new space is ready.

I know I said this is a forward looking project and would be happening probably next year, but these things fell into place and I feel comfortable with the decisions I have made.

Sorry for the long winded letter, but I am a little excited.
