We discussed reinstating the scholarship program that the club participated in in the past. Several club members participated in a field trip last weekend to the Rogers Quarry in Mitchell Indiana. We were treated to a tour of the quarry and were allowed to collect specimens. Several of the attendees brought samples of their finds to the club meeting. Among the specimens were solid quartz horned coral, geodes, conglomerate pyrite, cube pyrite, calcite, selenite (they had just opened an area and found thick selenite of which several members acquired large plates. Pretty exciting as we were the first club to hunt this area.).

I was touring an area on Friday for geode hunting and the landowner invited me to bring other members along. Five of us were treated to walking up a creek bed where everywhere one looked was geodes. We collected numerous geodes along with horned coral and a complete arrowhead.

We have been invited back as a club to hunt the area. Following the hunt, we were taken back to his lay down area where we saw amazing geodes in all shapes and sizes. Some were as big as basketballs. We also saw geodes that have been split with amazing interiors. We were allowed to purchase these geodes at a very good price. Continued next page.
