



If you plan on going, make sure you have MSHA training and the following; 1) safety toe boots / shoes, 2) safety glasses, 3) long pants, 4) Hard hat, and 5) ANSI class 2 safety vest One mentioned a few more items; 1) Leather gloves, 2) Strobe light, 3) Safety flag, and 4) wheel chocks.



Above are a few links for examples. <u>You DO NOT have to purchase these exact items</u>. They are examples only. I foresee more quarries wanting items like these in the future. A few people may be able to carpool down into the quarry too so not everyone may need one. In March we plan to hold MSHA training for everyone.
