



our educational lectures open to the public, our youth program, our participation at several levels in the county fair, our little 2-room museum for classroom visits and home-schoolers, our hands-on activities for kids in YMCA summer camp, 4H, Scouts, the library's summer reading program, and more. Said one Rotary member at the conclusion of my talk, "You guys sure are busy!" And no one had a clue.

So, with no official position designated in our By-Law and Operating Regulations, I've deputized myself as self-appointed VGMS Public Relations Chair. (Just don't tell anyone on our Board a rogue member is going maverick on them!)
